

Introduction

Veterinary Antibiotics:

1- Applied to large animal's feed and poultry drinking water as a preventive agent and to increase growth

2-After excretion, it may find its way to agriculture soil or irrigation water and this affects the quality of produce

3- It may cause antimicrobial resistance in the soil

Purpose

- Measure the uptake of **Gentamicin** and **Oxytetracycline** by lettuce, radish and cucumber from contaminated irrigation water.
- Effect of manure on antibiotic absorption

Methods

A greenhouse pot experiment on radish, cucumber, and lettuce with 6 treatments and 3 replicates was conducted at AUB in June 2020.

The 6 treatments were:

1-Soil irrigated with fresh water

2-Soil irrigated with 20 mg/lit oxytetracycline

3-Soil irrigated with 20 mg/lit gentamicin

4-Soil +5% manure irrigated with fresh water

5-Soil +5% manure irrigated with 20 mg/lit oxytetracycline

6-Soil +5% manure irrigated with 20 mg/lit gentamicin

ELISA was used for antibiotic analysis

Results and Discussion



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- Gentamicin uptake was higher than oxytetracycline
- The 5% added manure caused an increase in gentamicin uptake

Implications

- Control haphazard use of antibiotics
- Use antibiotics for treating sick animals and not as preventive agent
- Expand animal husbandry, hygiene, and health management on farms and improve vaccination programs
